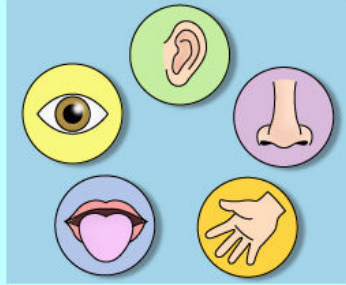


# Concrete vs. abstract nouns

Concrete nouns can be experienced by at least 1 of your 5 senses. You see them, hear them, smell them, taste them, and feel them.



Examples of concrete nouns: computer, book, mouse, rocket, book, room, school, house, clock, perfume, cloud, smoke

Abstract nouns cannot be experienced by any of your 5 senses. An abstract noun is an idea, emotion, feeling, or quality that cannot be detected by the five senses.

Hint: To find out if a word is concrete or abstract, see if you're able to hold it. If it is something that is tangible, then it is concrete; if not, then it is abstract.



Examples: education, love, speed, wisdom, beauty, sadness, communication
